Glasgow Declaration Climate Action in Tourism



- **develop** an international statistical framework for measuring tourism's role in sustainable development, including economic, environmental and social dimensions
- **support** the credibility, comparability and outreach of various measurement and monitoring programmes pertaining to sustainable tourism
- integrated information base to better inform on sustainable tourism, facilitate dialogue between different sectors and encourage locally relevant decision making

MST Pilots

- The importance of pilots in advancing the MST Framework.
- Austria, Spain (Canary Islands), the Netherlands, Italy, and Sweden are currently being developed.
- Country experiences from Germany, Spain and Greece.
- Pilots contribute real-world lessons testing the MST Framework from both a policy perspective and in terms of technical feasibility.
- Other pilots from around the world: Canada, Fiji, Mexico, Philippines, Saudi Arabia, and Wales.







Global Tourism Plastics Initiative

- Address the root causes of plastic pollution
- Businesses, governments and other tourism stakeholders
- 157 signatories worldwide
- 58 signatories from 17 European countries



Glasgow Declaration Climate Action in Tourism

- Cut global tourism emissions by at least a half over the next decade
- Reach net zero emissions as soon as possible before 2050
- 800+ signatories from across 90 ٠ countries
- 450 signatories from 32 European countries

The GYTS platform includes a series of international events, workshops and other educational initiatives, that give children and youth an opportunity to learn, share and discuss ideas, and to shape their visions for the future of sustainable tourism within the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.





SORRENTO CALL TO ACTION

Youth for Sustainable Tourism

We, the youth of 57 countries gathered on the occasion of the 1st Global Youth Tourism Summit, in Sorrento, Italy, from 27 June to 3 July 2022, organized by the World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) and the Ministry of Tourism of Italy, adopt the following "Sorrento Call to Action: Youth for Sustainable Tourism"

We greatly value the efforts of the hosts, organizers, and partners of this Summit to create the GYTS platform, which allows the voices of the world's youth to be heard in connection with tourism within the global framework of the UN Agenda 2030 and 17 Sustainable Development Goals and, to share our concerns, ideas, visions, and aspirations for a better future for all.

We firmly believe that the current crises create an excellent opportunity for transformation and that tourism enables societies and local communities around the world to prosper in ways that respect for the planet, natural and cultural heritages, as well as promotes mutual understanding.

THEREFORE, RECALLING:

UN General Assembly Resolution 70/1 of 25 September 2015 on Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the 17 Sustainable Development Goals,

United Nations Youth 2030 Strategy: Working with and For Young People of 24 September 2018, the firstever UN system-wide strategy on youth,

UNWTO Global Code of Ethics for Tourism, adopted by Resolution A/RES/406(XIII) at the thirteenth UNWTO General Assembly in 1999 and acknowledged by the United Nations General Assembly in 2001,

UNWTO Recommendations "Supporting Jobs and Economics through Travel and Tourism – A Call for Arion to Mitigate the Socio-Economic Impact of COVID-19 and Accelerate Recovery", a set of recommendations calling for urgent and strong support to help the global tourism sector recover from the unprecedented challenge of COVID-19,

UNWTO Priorities for Global Tourism Recovery and the UNWTO Global Guidelines to Restart Tourism, prepared by the Global Tourism Crisis Committee to guide the response of the tourism sector to the COVID-19 crisis and to build the foundations for future resilience and sustainable development,

One Planet Vision for a Responsible Recovery of the Tourism Sector, which provides guidance on key lines of actions for responsible tourism recovery for people, planet and prosperity;

United Nation's Policy Brief "COVID-19 and Transforming Tourism", launched by the UN Secretary-General on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on tourism, which provides recommendations to policymakers for socio-economic recovery measures to integrate decisive and innovative responses for the broad and complex tourism ecosystem, enhancing youth empowerment and participation in the tourism sector
