### **Djisman Simandjuntak**

Djisman Simandjuntak is a Professor of Business Economics and Rector of Prasetya Mulya University in Jakarta. His special interest is on Collaborative-Dual higher education and international partnership.

He is Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Centre for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) Foundation.

He is co-founding Chairman of the Indonesian Institute for Corporate Directorship (IICD).

He is an Independent Commissioner at PT Indo Tambangraya Megah (a Thai Banpu Group of Company), an Independent Commissioner at PT Asuransi MSIG Indonesia, the President Commissioner at PT Indomarco Prismatama, and the President Commissioner at PT Indoritel Makmur Internasional.

His other activities include being the Chairman of the Indonesian National Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation (INCPEC), Chairman of the Supervisory Board of the Regional Autonomy Watch, and member of the Advisory Council of the Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

He is a member of the experts panel of the Indonesian Economists Association (ISEI/Ikatan Sarjana Ekonomi), member of the American Economic Association, member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, member of the European Philosophy of Science Association (EPSA), and member of the International Association of University Presidents (IAUP).

He is often invited to speak and write in national as well as international forum.

He was a member of the Indonesia Economic Forum, formerly known as the National Economic Council (Komite Ekonomi Nasional/KEN) of Indonesia which was founded in 2010, and member of the National Team of Expert Advisors for the International Trade Forum in the Indonesian Ministry of Trade, from 2005 until 2014.

He was Independent Commissioner at LippoBank from 2003 to 2005. From 1999 to 2011 he was Chairman of the IICD Advisory Board.

Djisman Simandjuntak obtained his Ph.D. degree in Economics from the Faculty of Economics and Social Sciences of the University of Cologne, Germany, in 1983 (majoring in International Economics).
